Crisis Intervention Training for School Resource Officers FDLE #1401 - 24 Hours

Course Description

This course is intended to equip school resource officers with the specialized intervention skills required for first responders to mental health and substance abuse crises in a K-12 school.

This specialized course mirrors the nationally recognized Memphis Model. It prepares the SRO to respond immediately to a student in crisis. Officers will learn about common mental health and behavioral issues, de-escalation techniques, involuntary commitment, and supporting students as they re-enter school after treatment. Crisis intervention training is required for all SROs under s.1006.12(1)(c), F.S. This course is intended to help fulfill that need.

Course Topics Include: Prevention and Crisis Intervention, Treatment and Re-Entry.

Students must pass an end-of-course examination with a minimum score of 80%
