Course Description

This course will introduce the officer to the rules of breath alcohol analysis, using the Intoxilyzer 8000 Series. Student will learn the role of the breath test operator, the instrumentation used to analyze breath test samples according to Chapter 11D-8 Florida Administrative Code, how to obtain a proper breath test sample, the proper way to administer a breath test using the Intoxilyzer 8000, and how to testify regarding the breath test that was conducted through courtroom testimony.

Each student must also successfully demonstrate proficiency in administering a breath test and completing the associated paperwork, as well as pass a written examination.
